ART

Community Art Program (PreK-6)

Artists, ages 3 years to 6th grade come from all over Compton to dance, sing, draw, paint and have fun attending our free week-long Art camp. All supplies and materials are provided, including a meal each day.

The program is designed to empower and expose students to critical thinking, collaboration, and creative problem solving in the arts.



Little Creators Program (0-4 years)

Young artists, ages 0-4 years, receive an art kit filled with supplies and activities to explore and create in their own homes. All supplies and materials are provided.

The program is designed to empower and expose our youngest students to sensory play, motor skill development, and creative problem solving in the arts.



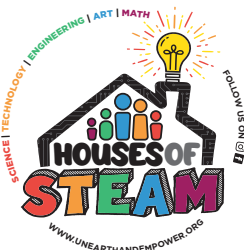
Compton Mural Project (6-9 graders)

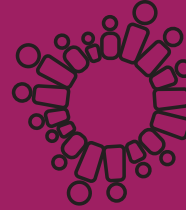

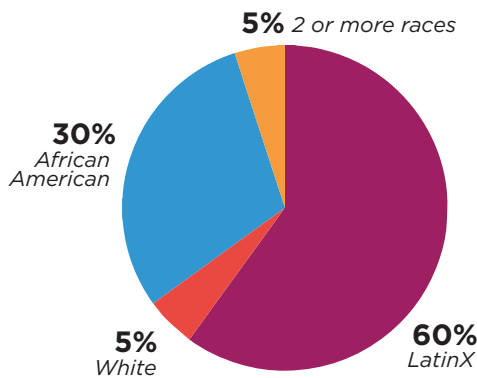

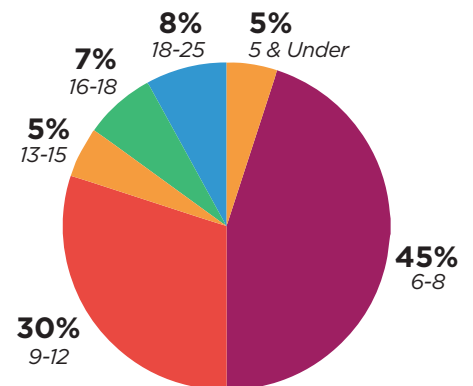
